# Have a Great Idea for a Plenary Presentation?

You can submit a presentation for the RIPE Meeting Plenary

It will be reviewed by the RIPE Programme Committee (PC)

Keep an eye out for the Call for Presentations - usually opens six months before the meeting

# Check out a BoF

"Birds of a Feather" - people with the same interests gathering to talk about a particular topic/issue

Takes place at the end of the day

Ad hoc, informal

No remote participation
