Check out a BoF

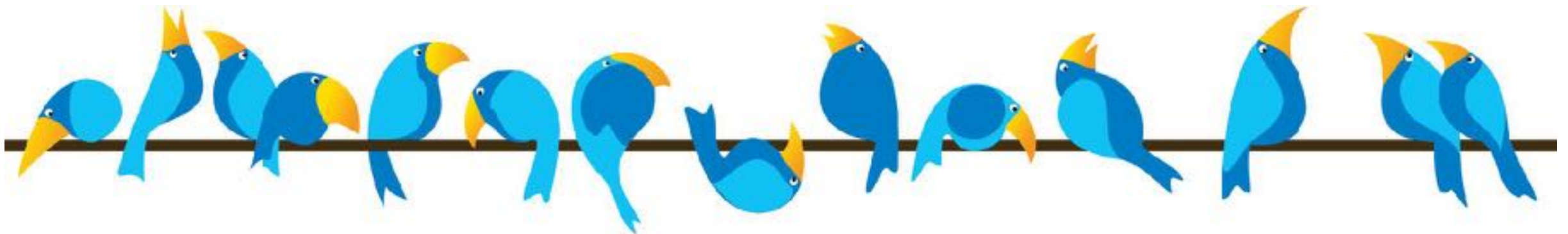
“Birds of a Feather” - **people with the same interests gathering to talk about a particular topic/issue**

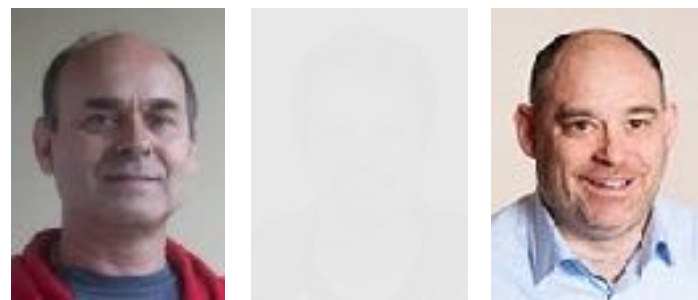

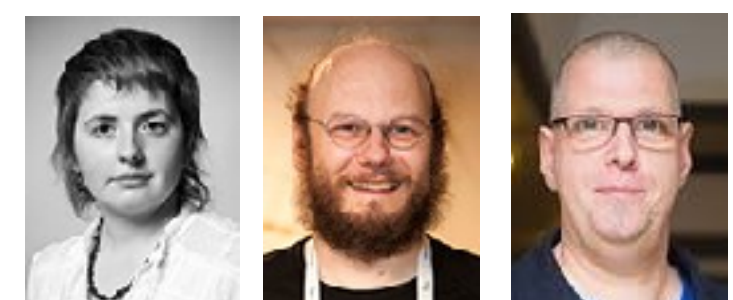
